PUBLIC HEARING:

At 7:00 p.m. District Clerk, Michelle Freeman, called the Public Hearing to order and recited the pledge of allegiance.

Mr. Niznik gave a power point presentation on the proposed 2021-2022 Budget going over the Educational Initiatives, Budget Consideration, Enrollment Trend/Projected Enrollment, Budget Reductions, Budget Additions, Tax Levy, Three Part Budget which includes Programs, Capital and Administration and Board member election.

Mr. Brach asked if there was anything for gifted and talented. Mr. Niznik stated right now focus is on mainly learning loss due to hybrid/remote learning.

At 7:35 p.m. Mr. Kramer called the Regular Board meeting to order.

PRESIDENT'S MOMENT:

After all the do's and don'ts, plus and minuses regarding sports, things have been successful; football, girls' soccer and now into spring sports.

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PUBLIC FORUM:

Marie Yager – Thanked Board members and teachers for all they do, the district is doing a great job being there for all of our students.

ADMINISTRATOR REPORTS:

Mr. Teachout – Director of Facilities:

- Since last meeting grounds crew has been busy with spring cleanup of fields, using track, both exciting and frustrating.
- Coordinating 100K project with architects.
- Ag room and tech shop windows being replaced.
- Pool lights are on, brighter in there, painting being done, gaining momentum.
- Large group instruction room will be turned back over, a lot brighter in there.

Mr. Brach asked about a pricing update on the lift in the bus garage, in-ground system would work best. Mr. Teachout said he will get a budget number on that.

Mrs. Weber – West Leyden Elementary Principal:

- West Leyden Elementary competed in the Water Safari reading contest with 44 students participating.
- 11 teachers have volunteered to pilot new math series for K-5. Our current math series is outdated. On May 17th those 11 teachers will come together to give pros and cons of each series and will present at the June 8th BOE meeting.

Mr. Brach asked how long new math series will last. Mrs. Weber stated it has about a 4-5 year lifecycle due to updates.

Jill Schafer – Boonville Elementary Principal:

- She did get slimed as part of the PARP challenge.
- Boonville Elementary is planning end of year events. Looking a little different this year, not able to have usual field trips, but getting creative to make the end of the year a fun and special experience. Going to livestream awards so everyone can see.
- Wrapping up the Water Safari reading contest, lots of reading going on.
- Building Science kits have consisted of chicks, geckos and fish.
- Celebrated teacher and nurse appreciation with a luncheon put on by the Boonville Elementary PTA.
- Thank you to the Transportation Dept. and Custodians for everything since we have been back to in-person learning.

Jill Rowlands-Will – Middle School Principal:

- National Junior Honor Society doing tie-dye week making t-shirts to be positive. They are accepting donations.
- We appreciate our MS teachers and staff so to recognize them thank you notes were written and posted on the wall for everyone to see.
- Thank you to Mrs. McGrath, this being our first year with computer-based testing, it went very smoothly.

Mrs. Smith – High School Principal & Mrs. McGrath – Director of Technology, Curriculum & Instruction:

- Met a week ago with English, Living Environment, Algebra I and Earth Science department chairs about Regents to consider ideas/incentives for students to take the exams and to consider exam score in course averages for those who take them. If students take exam and the grade is higher than the course score, it will be replaced with the lowest marking period grade for the course. This would only be for this year due to COVID.
- ELA testing was done in April with a very high percentage of participation, very positive experience.

Mr. Maneen – Transportation Supervisor:

- Has been a rough couple of weeks with drivers being out, sports runs. Transportation Dept. does a great job.
- On a positive note, new driver-in-training to start next week.
- Gearing up for the end of the school year. Looking at summer school and summer camp, will have sign up for drivers.

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Mrs. Foye – Director of Special Education:

- On May 19th interview committee will hold interviews for the Special Education Teacher position.
- Bathroom completed in the 12:1:3:1 room at the middle school.
- CPSE/CSE meetings are scheduled for June 1st and 2nd, outcome will go on for the June board meeting.
- 2020 Accountability Status Determination, Adirondack met compliance.
- Policy committee met and there are three policies on tonight for approval.

Mr. Roberts – Asst. HS Principal/Interim Athletic Director:

- We have a few scholar athletes for winter and fall II sports, must maintain a 90% average.
- Spring JV and Varsity sports are underway.
- Numbers were down in the area wrestling program. We are out competing. Modified wrestling did not materialize because of low numbers.
