

**BOARD OF EDUCATION

MINUTES OF SPECIAL VOTE MEETING
TUESDAY, OCTOBER 24, 2023**

At the Special Vote Meeting of the qualified voters of the Adirondack Central School District, Oneida County, New York, held at the Adirondack High School, in Boonville, New York, in said School District, on the 24th day of October, 2023, at 12:00 o'clock p.m., prevailing time.

Prior to the opening of the polls, the voting scanners to be used at the meeting were examined by County Election Inspectors; the counters were at zero and the scanners were, in all respect, in proper condition for use.

At 12:00 o'clock p.m., prevailing time, the Permanent Chairperson, Michelle Freeman, announced the voting would proceed. The polls were declared open and all duly qualified voters desiring to vote at any time until 8:00 o'clock p.m., prevailing time, were entitled to cast their vote upon the proposition contained in the Notice of the Special Vote. Attached hereto is a sample paper ballot.

At 8:00 o'clock p.m., prevailing time, the Permanent Chairperson, Michelle Freeman, announced that all voters in the polling place at or before 8:00 o'clock p.m., having been allowed to vote, the polls were declared closed.

Immediately upon the close of the polls, the Election Inspectors and District Clerk proceeded to canvass the vote, and made the following report:

▼ **PROPOSITION** ▼

Shall the Board of Education of the Adirondack Central School District be authorized to (i) purchase and finance three (3) electric student transport vehicles including related charging equipment and (ii) reconstruct the bus garage to accommodate electric charging stations, including, for both, necessary furnishings, fixtures and equipment and all other costs incidental thereto, and expend a total sum not to exceed \$1,329,738, which is estimated to be the total maximum cost thereof, and said amount, or so much thereof as may be necessary after applying \$1,185,000 of expected EPA Grant monies and \$27,500 from the sale of three retired buses, shall be raised by the levy of a tax upon the taxable property of said School District and collected in annual installments as provided by Section 416 of the Education Law; and, in anticipation of such tax, obligations of said School District in the principal amount not to exceed \$117,238 shall be issued.
