Update from Kristy McGrath, Superintendent

Dear Adirondack Community,

Welcome back to the 2023-24 school year! I always enjoy putting together this newsletter for you, because I have great pride in letting you know about the amazing work that is taking place in our school community. Below I have outlined some of the new things happening:



- Free Meals Continue in 2023-24: Adirondack qualifies for Community Eligibility Provision (CEP), since we meet the required percentage of free and reduced students. In an effort to provide free breakfast and lunch to all students, NYS is paying the remaining portion of food costs this year, so all students can receive free breakfast and lunch daily at no additional cost to the District. Another benefit of being CEP is that all of our school families qualify for a \$30 discount monthly on internet, and there are discounts towards devices. - New Graduation Measures Coming: The Blue Ribbon Commission is a group of stakeholders from across NY who
 have been meeting since 2019 with the State Education Department. We expect this group to make revisions to what is
 required for graduating in NY. This fall (soon) we expect more information. The first group of students who will be impacted by these changes are our current 9th graders (the graduating class of 2027). - Video Cameras to Monitor Vehicles Passing Stopped School Buses: The statistics are startling for the number of
 vehicles passing stopped school buses daily. In partnership with Verra Mobility and Oneida County, we expect to soon
 have video cameras on the sides of our buses, which are activated by the stop arms. This is at no cost to the District. Verra Mobility oversees all videos and the issuance of tickets when appropriate. It is imperative, when a bus is
 stopped, with its red lights on, for passing vehicles to stop.
- Therapy Dogs: We have a group of five staff members who have been working very hard over the past year to get their dogs approved as therapy dogs. The staff members all voluntarily attended dog obedience training in the spring with Mrs. LaFave (who also volunteered her services). Some of the dogs are in the final stages of approval through the Alliance of Therapy Dogs, so we expect that we will have dogs in the buildings sometime in the next few months. The research and testimonials from districts that have therapy dogs is inspiring. I'm very appreciative of the five staff members who have shown passion and enthusiasm for this initiative.
- Updated School Website: Take a look at our new website design! https://www.adirondackcsd.org/
- Attendance Matters: All across the country attendance has continued to be an issue since returning from
 Covid. Adirondack will be sending home an attendance letter to each parent with each progress report and report
 card. This letter will allow parents to see their child's absences, compared to the other students in the same grade (in a
 graph), to have a comparative reference. Please support us in our efforts to get students in school. In 2022-23, 27% of
 our District students were considered chronically absent (missing 10% or more of school).
 It is a necessity and priority
 of ours to improve this.
- New Sci 5 and 8 Exams: In 2023-24 we will administer updated Science exams in 5th and 8th grades to match the new Science standards. The tests will be administered in 1 day and will be taken on the computer.
- Adirondack Staff Social Club: In an effort to build a positive culture and increase staff opportunities, a group of staff
 members will be planning a few social events for our staff to participate in outside of school hours. We kicked this off
 last year with a Team Adirondack Staff Night at the Boonville Lumberjacks Game in June. This year we have already
 planned a Utica Comets Adirondack Staff Night in March, and we hope to have some other fun events scheduled.
- Instructional Changes:
 - Revised AIS Plan to support students who are not meeting grade level expectations (if you'd like to see the plan it's on our website https://www.adirondackcsd.org/board-of-education/policies)
 - 6th Gr (math and ELA classes increased to 62 minutes, rather than 42, and we added a 10-week social emotional learning class for 6th grade)
 - ♦ First Tech Challenge class added to the High School
 - ♦ Lab time was added to support Chemistry and Algebra II, with a focus on improving our percentage of students earning a Regents with Advanced Designation

There are even many more things happening each and every day! It is with great pride that I lead this District. I am extremely appreciative of the hard work and commitment to our District from all of you. Thank you for continuing to support our schools and students!



Grants the District has applied for and received...

Cafeteria Equipment Grant

Mrs. Cihocki, Business Administrator, submitted a Cafeteria Equipment Grant on behalf of the District. We were awarded a cafeteria equipment grant of \$19,464 for a tilt kettle at the high school, and \$19,987 for a combination convention & steam oven at Boonville Elementary.



UPK Expansion Grant

Mrs. McGrath, Superintendent, applied for a UPK Expansion Grant. The District was awarded \$125,000 for 2023-2024. Adirondack was able to add a 4 year old classroom due to this funding. Per NY

guidelines we can only have 18 UPK students per class-room (w/1 aide). We had an extensive waitlist. By adding a classroom we have been able to accommodate all registered UPK students.




Our COVID stimulus money will be expiring at the end of the 2023-2024 school year. The district is always looking for grants. We recently applied for the Stronger Connections Grant (\$1.135 million; Nov. 2023-Sept. 2026) and RECOVS Learning Loss Grant (\$512,000; 2023-2025). We are anxiously awaiting to hear if we will be awarded either grant.

Burns & McDonnell Honors Local Family With STEAM Award


On Tuesday, October 2nd, the engineering company of Burns & McDonnell awarded the ACS STEAM Program with a significant grant. The funding of this grant will be used to benefit the students in the ACS STEAM Program. The funds will assist in procuring equipment and materials that will be used in their projects. The Hennesseys have been crucial in connecting the company to the local community and the school district. Burns & McDonnell is a global company that is working with National Grid to update and replace a large portion of the power grid here in the north country. In their time here Burns & McDonnell has made a concerted effort to reach out to the school and community to help make improvements in both. The ACS STEAM program would like to thank Burns & McDonnell for the award and thank the Hennessey family for all their support as they look forward to more partnerships with Burns & McDonnell in the future. 








Manufacturing Day Field Trip





Sienna Snyder recently attended the 2023 Project Fibonacci STEAM Leadership Conference, along with select Scholars from across NYS and beyond to confront the relevant issues of climate change. Sienna was nominated and selected to participate because of her outstanding achievements and accomplishments, her love of science, and for her leadership qualities as someone who could offer ideas for adapting to climate change, design an action plan to tackle the climate crisis, and inspire others to join in the fight for a healthier, more sustainable, equitable future and a better tomorrow. Sienna gained perspectives from inspiring leaders, advocates, scientists, and innovators who are at the forefront of combatting the climate crisis, such as Ginger Zee (Chief Meteorologist on Good Morning America and the ABC News), "Science Bob" Pflugfelder (Science teacher and author, who is also a regular guest on many shows such as Jimmy Kimmel, Live With Kelly and Mark, The Today Show, and The Dr. Oz Show), and Dr. Robert Hazen (Mineralogist, astrobiologist, and Senior Staff Scientist at the Carnegie Institution's Geophysical Laboratory and



Clarence Robinson Professor of Earth Sciences at George Mason University). 
