

I am a mom of 3 kids. I love animals and enjoy gardening and reading. I am a high school graduate of Adirondack.




Aaron Woodworth - Bus Driver



Spring 2024 State Exams 3-8

Adirondack had excellent participation on the 2023 exams, and we expect this to continue in 2024. Taking standardized tests is a long-standing and essential practice in education, and the results provide us valuable information to improve our instruction. Remember, the assessment scores are no longer

included in teacher evaluation, and they are solely to give the district data to continually im-

prove

We have implemented new curriculum: ELA K-5 CKLA, ELA 6-8 Amplify, Mathematics K-5 enVisions, and Mathematics 6-8 Eureka². In addition we have implemented new Rally assess-

ments, as practice for the state exams and for standards-based learning. We are confident that our students and teachers are ready for these exams. All tests are taken on computers.

"Shout out to Boonville Elementary 5th grade math. For the past two years, we have had excellent results at this grade and subject. In 2022 61% of our Boonville Elementary 5th graders

earned a 3 or 4 on their state math exam, and in 2023, 69% of the students did. To give a comparison, in our BOCES region, 29% earned a 3 or 4 in 2022, and 42% did in 2023. Keep up the great work!"

First in math

This spring, NYSED and First in Math will again be holding a Statewide Mathematics Tournament. All New York State students in grades 1-5 who are enrolled in the First in Math program are invited to participate. The virtual regional qualifying round for the tournament will take place on March 21, 2024. We are excited to have students participate in this regional qualifying event. All of our students in grades K-5 have access to the First in Math program. First in Math is an online math practice tool that leverages students' love of gaming to build skills and math fluency. Together Boonville and West Leyden Elementary students have solved over 940,000 questions on First in Math this year! We celebrate and acknowledge our top players and teams each week, and our students are recognized on our First in Math Wall of Fame bulletin boards as they reach various milestones. Our students are excited to play and improve their math skills.






The ACS STEAM Program ACS IS FULL STEAM AHEAD!!!!!!!!!!

On Sunday January 21st, the ACS RobotCats team traveled to MVCC for their first ever First Tech Challenge event. FTC is a global robotics competition in which teams design, build, program, and operate robots to compete in head to head challenges in alliance forms. Guided by adult coaches and mentors, students develop STEAM skills and practice engineering principles, while realizing the value of hard work, innovation, and working as a team.


This marks Adirondacks first year participating in the FTC competition. While ACS students initiated the program last year, they focused on building a functional robot without entering the competition. Armed with the knowledge gained from the previous year, this year's students successfully constructed a robot and entered the competition. The RoboCats had a commendable performance, securing the 13th position out of 20 schools. Winning two out of five qualifying matches, they gained valuable experience throughout the day.



The MVCC competition proved to be a transformative experience for the RoboCats. Their robot performed exceptionally well, and the students gleaned numerous lessons on robotics and collaboration. Building connections with players from other teams, ACS team members laid the foundation for future collaborations. The RoboCats extend their congratulations to our neighbor to the north, South Lewis, as they finished 5th in the competition and reached the elimination round. The South Lewis team, along with coach Liz Vaerewyck, played a pivotal role in assisting Adirondack in establishing their FTC team, without whom the RoboCats wouldn't have been able to compete.

Vaping Informational Assembly

Adirondack High School and Middle School welcomed youth motivational speaker, Robb Holla, to our school for a vaping assembly that was held on Thursday, November

MATHCATS

The Adirondack Mathcats competed in the AMC 8/10/12 competitions hosted by Utica University. There were twenty high school students (AMC 10/12) who traveled to Utica University on November 8th. Before the competition the students took a tour of the campus which included a highlight of going into the university's Esports Arena. There were around 90 students from various schools around the area who competed in the AMC 10/12 competition. The district is proud to announce that three 10th graders placed in the top three. Cora Hinsdill placed first and Lillian Brown and Alex Hinojosa tied for second place! With first place, Cora receives two free classes at Utica University. Lillian and Alex receive one free class each from Utica University. On January 20th, Utica University hosted the AMC 8 competition. There were four 8th graders and one 7th grader who competed. Adirondack, Remsen and Beaver River FFA Fall Trip & Tours

On November 17 & 18th, Adirondack FFA members partnered up with members from Remsen FFA and Beaver River FFA to participate in a mini agricultural tour and leadership training at Oswegatchie Educational Center. Friday the 17th started out with a stop at DiNitto's Dairy Farm



in Marcy, NY. where we toured the 600 cow dairy farm (1,200 animals total). We observed the milking process, learned about the freestall housing system and how cows are fed and kept comfortable, then visited with the baby calves. On our tour, Mrs. DiNitto reiterated the variety of possible jobs and careers that are involved in servicing and operating a dairy farm, as well as the employment skills that they are looking for in their employees.




Our next stop was to Countryside Veterinary Clinic in Lowville, NY. When we arrived, we met with Dr. Kenyon and Dr. Brigandi who discussed the daily workings of their veterinary clinic. Dr. Brigandi showed us her truck that she uses when making large animal farm calls and the tools, equipment and supplies that she needs to keep onboard. We toured the different areas of the clinic and got to peek in on a surgery being performed by Dr. Pauly. Finally we met with several members of the Countryside Veterinary Clinic staff, including veterinarians, veterinary technicians, client care specialists, kennel technicians and even human resources and general business managers. They discussed their varied backgrounds and paths to the positions that they currently hold, and that it's not always a straight path to reach your goals, but to take advantage of opportunities that come your way. Finally, Dr. Kenyon emphasized the importance of the personal and leadership qualities and skills in the potential employees that they hire into their business.

Our 3rd stop was to Shultz's Dairy Farm in Lowville. Here they have a small dairy farm, but also make cheese curd that is sold through their farm store as well as through local stores and outlets. Mr. Shultz discussed the cheese curd making process and how and why he got into it. We were able to look at the cheese-making room as he walked us through the process. This farm also has a couple of large wind turbines on their farmland that we were able to drive to and get a close up look at. Mr. Shultz shared his experience, pros and cons with having these on his property. Finally, before we left, we were treated to fresh samples of Shultz Farm cheese curd that we were able to enjoy for the rest of our trip.

Our next stop was to Cazenovia Equipment in Lowville where we met with John Williams, General Manager and Brad Allen, Sales Manager. They discussed their day-to-day jobs with us and how they got to be where they are today with Caz Equipment. They, once again, empha-

sized what they are looking for in employees, including the personal and communication skills, the ability to be "coachable" and trainable, and the leadership skills that FFA helps to build. We also toured their facility and observed the variety of jobs available in this type of business.



After getting settled in and a quick dinner, OEC staff led members in a couple of fun, team-building activities, followed by a campfire and socializing. 
